# Q2 Reasons why they are not very satisfied with – a. "the maintenance of footpaths"

### Poor condition/old/poorly maintained/slow to maintain/need upgrading

- "Generally unsatisfied, they seem to not do the main bits, pick and choose."
- "Not satisfied particularly with older footpaths, eg, Cambridge East."
- "Slow in the upkeep, Alpha Street took forever to repair."
- "Many in bad state of repair. In Leamington, Burns Street is particularly bad."
- "Not satisfied, Burns Street is bad."
- "Not well maintained in Pirongia."
- "Still a lot to be done, I'm not sure where."
- "Footpaths need repairing, for instance in Alexandra Street."
- "Not looked after well. Wallace Terrace footpaths are shocking."
- "Top of Alexandra Street, Te Awamutu, requires maintenance urgently."
- "Victoria Street, Cambridge, cobblestones need repairing."
- "Can do with more work overall. More maintenance required."
- "Sheridan Crescent is disgusting. Shakespeare Street is shocking."
- "Alpha Street, west of Bryce Street, Cambridge is shocking."
- "Shocking in Te Awamutu by Liquorland and the Veterinary Clinic in Mutu Street."
- "Many in bad state of repair. In Leamington, Burns Street is particularly bad. Goodfellow Street and Station Road are bad. Laurie Street, corner of Station Road East is very bad."
- "Hamilton Road footpaths are bad. I go on my mobility scooter, they're a bone shaker."
- "Carlyle Street to Shakespeare Street, Campbell Street and Thompson Street are very difficult with a wheel chair."
- "Poorly maintained in Pirongia."
- "Not well maintained in Pirongia."
- "Not looked after very well in Te Awamutu. Wallace Terrace footpaths are shocking."
- "Half of Whitaker Street, is done, need to complete the other half."
- "Still places they could do better, ie, North East Cambridge."
- "No maintenance in the last four or five years since we moved to Pirongia. In Te Awamutu there are paths that looked ok and yet they have been redone."
- "Lots of streets mucked up with the laying of fibre optic cabling."
- "Repairs started never finished in Carlyle Street, Tennyson Street and Thompson Street."
- "Weld Street is the worst, now doing it up."
- "Older parts of the town neglected."
- "Weld Street now digging up, it's been bad for years."
- "Pirongia needs to be upgraded in the area overall. Also needs a tidy up."
- "In a wheel chair. Main street in Te Awamutu, Alexandra Street, is hard for me."
- "Not good outside main centre, Bryce Street between Clare Street and Hamilton Road."
- "End of Te Awamutu town ship heading toward Pirongia."
- "Thompson Street needs more repair of the footpaths."
- "Took over four years to fix the hole in path in Franklin St and not done the way they said they were going to do it."
- "Lots of footpaths are not up to standard in Leamington area. Need maintenance."

### <u>Uneven/cracked/broken/potholes/rough</u>

- "In general footpaths are a bit rough in places for the elderly."
- "Cobblestones are rough in Victoria Street. Need repairing."
- "Rutherford Street needs repair. Footpaths have been broken for ages."
- "In Alexandra Street by the College also in front of Paper Plus the slabs are very irregular' high risk of tripping."
- "Some up and down in Te Awamutu. Need to repair and level them."
- "Tripped over on several of them, eg, Weld Street, Thornton Road and Bowen Street. Need levelling and repair."
- " Hall Street, Cambridge, uneven surfaces."
- "Wilson Street, opposite the Veterinary clinic very bad and uneven."
- "Broken footpaths in Piquet Hill Road, Te Awamutu. Need repairing."
- "Rutherford Street footpaths have been broken for ages, need repair."
- "Could be better. Footpath levels in Burns Street, Leamington is quite bad."
- "Some paths are up and down in Te Awamutu. Need to repair and level them."
- "Generally, need to work to get more fixed, ie, uneven and breaking up."
- "Some uneven ones. I have tripped on occasions."
- "Not all that safe in places, uneven surfaces."
- "Opposite the playground on Oriki Street there's a whole section of the footpath where there is a lip."
- "Lots of footpaths all over town are uneven and difficult for elderly."
- "Use a scooter and most paths in Mangapiko Street are bumpy. One end is all stones."
- "Crooked and wonky, not good for prams. Goodfellow Street is bad."
- "Could be better, they're a bit rough."
- "Burns Street is bad in Leamington. Footpaths are sunken."
- "They have improved some but some are still uneven in Te Awamutu."
- "In Te Awamutu, overall, tree roots growing through broken paths."
- "Goodfellow Street breaking up, holes in the footpath."
- "Footpath in Northleigh Place has sunk. Reported this to Council, inspected but work not done despite a promise to do so."
- "Loose gravel, shady and wet by Golf course in Te Awamutu."
- "Drops down in lots of places unsatisfactory for a mobility scooter."
- "Fort Street uneven, potholed and rough surface."
- "Burns Street footpath is uneven."
- "Rutherford Street needs repair. Footpaths have been broken for ages."
- "Tree roots causing problems in Victoria Road."
- "In King Street path has cracks and is uneven."
- "Tripped up on tree roots in Byron Street, cracks in paths in Thompson Street."
- "Footpaths very broken. Grey Street is bad. Curbs are broken."
- " Uneven and rough. Not in good repair overall, especially for elderly persons."
- "Walk and run a lot in Cambridge town. Paths are broken chipped, and uneven."
- "Roots from trees in Cambridge town a problem."
- "Tree roots can be dangerous on some footpaths."
- "Very rough. Weld Street is the worst, now doing it up."
- "In Weld Street, tree roots are a problem."
- "Footpaths uneven greenbelt, Robertson Street and Taylor Street."

### No footpaths/not enough/one side only

- "Lack of footpaths in Leamington, only on one side."
- "Not enough footpaths in Cambridge East."
- "Some streets in Kihikihi with no footpaths. Station Road is bad. Laurie Street, on the corner of Station Road East, it's very bad, no footpath."
- "Arnold Street footpath only on one side."
- "Need more footpaths in Pirongia, only on one side."
- "No footpaths in Kane Street, Baffin Street and towards Baffin Street Bridge. Baffin Street to McClure Street down to Waipa River no footpath and it's a Main Highway in Pirongia."
- "Lived in Kihikihi district for 15 years still waiting for footpaths in Hill Road."
- "No footpath outside our house, stops at the top of Puriu Road, Te Awamutu."
- "Could be more footpaths in Pirongia."
- "No footpaths on our side of the village in Pirongia."
- "Crozier Street has a path only on one side."
- "No footpaths between Kihikihi and Te Awamutu, also Awanui Avenue."
- "No footpaths where we live, two blocks from the city centre, corner Bryce Street and Alfred Street."
- "Walk and run a lot in Cambridge town. Some streets don't have footpaths, mostly round the Cambridge East area."
- "Would like footpaths on both sides in Campbell Street, Cambridge."
- "Pavement on one side of the street only in Scott Street, Carlyle Street to Tennyson Street."
- "Half the footpaths are not there in Lamb Street."
- "Hall Street needs footpath on both sides."
- "Beachy Street by the school needs footpaths on both sides."

### Overhanging trees/growth over the footpath/leaves on footpath and in drains

- "Too many leaves in Moore Street, Cambridge."
- "Leaves blocking grates. Not good in Puniu Road,
- "Branches overhanging in Leamington, Scott Street on from Campbell Street and in Thompson Street."
- "New paths at Kahikatea Park covered in vegetation."
- "I understand the footpaths need to be 1m x 2m. At least a third of the paths in Cambridge have branches overhanging. Have to bend regularly. I'm 6ft tall."
- "Cherry trees in Campbell Street need a trim, bang our heads when mowing the berm."

### Poor access/footpath to road/kerbing

- "In Pirongia we haven't got concrete crossing from footpath to road."
- "It's hard for mobility scooters in Tennyson Street and Carter's Flat, Cambridge. There are shops in Carters Flat but not accessible."

### Poor quality of work/materials used/too much patching

- "Wordsworth Street is bad. They did a bad job of fixing it."
- "Slabs irregular. Mix of concrete and asphalt makes them uneven. High risk of tripping, Alexandra Street by College, also in front of Paper Plus."
- "Queen Street patched frequently, leaves them uneven. Has mobility scooter, too difficult to drive on footpath."
- "Footpaths not wide enough, greenbelt, Robertson Street and Taylor Street."

### Too narrow

- "Too small and narrow, not wide enough."
- "I understand footpaths need to be 1m x 2m. Can't walk two abreast comfortably on some of them."

### <u>Others</u>

- "Bikes and scooters and skaters are a menace."
- "In Main Street, they laid pavers, then pulled them up a couple of years later and then dumped them in Rewi Street and then put down new ones. This is a waste of Rate Payers' money."
- "Footpaths covered in litter, smashed glass also stones in Ohaupo."
- "Moore Street, Cambridge, slippery, too many leaves."

# Q2 Reasons why they are not very satisfied with – b. "the maintenance of roads in the District"

### Poor condition/poorly maintained/slow to maintain

- "I live in Hall Street, 20 years overdue for an overhaul."
- "Alexandra Street needs maintenance."
- "Maungatautari Ward needs a better service."
- "Not very satisfied with the way they allow the roads to get rough."
- "Maungakawa Road not maintained enough."
- "Rural roads in general badly maintained."
- "General around the district. Not enough time and money to get things done."
- "Lack of upkeep of Godfrey Road. Gravel road and it needs more attention."
- "Maintenance needs to be more vigorous."
- "Side roads not maintained enough."
- "Some roads are maintained well but others are not particularly the minor roads."
- "I see a lot of damaged roads."
- "Poor maintenance need better quality."

### Potholes/uneven/rough/bumpy

- "Potholes, and is corrugated. Have to ring to get the grader out."
- "Potholes on corner of Thompson Street."
- "Rough surfaces in Shakespeare Street."
- "Frontier Road potholes need repairing."
- "Potholes at roundabout in the main street of Te Awamutu getting worse."
- "Upper part of Duke Street very rough, needs maintenance."
- "Potholes around Pollard Drive need repairing."
- "A lot of potholes in Pokuru Road, need repairing."
- "Potholes by Fresh Choice and Pak 'n Save in Te Awamutu."
- "Depression in road corner of Hall Street and Queen Street."
- "Massive potholes in Mutu Street need repairing."
- "Too many potholes not fixed, Sloane Street, Arapuni Road and outside Pak 'n Save."
- "Potholes in Rotorangi Road."
- "Potholes and corrugations Luck-at-Last Road."
- "Te Miro Road potholed and corrugated."
- "Waipaki Road is potholed and dangerous."
- "Potholes in Arapuni Road."
- "Mary Church Road, before intersection of SH 1B, potholes, needs resealing, very dangerous."
- "Paterangi Road at dairy factory, a lot of potholes."
- "Alexandra Street is a lumpy road."
- "Too many potholes throughout the area."
- "Potholes in Smart Road."
- "Potholes on Racecourse Road, Te Awamutu."

### Constant road works/slow to complete/inconvenience

- "Big hole in Olive Road and two big holes on corner. Dangerous, couldn't go wide to avoid, it took two months to fix."
- "Hall Street has a strip prepared for sealing but has been untouched for years."
- "Some roads have big potholes and it takes a long time to get done, ie, Arapuni Road."
- "Kairangi Road, work took too long and right before Christmas."

### Poor quality of work/materials used/too much patching

- "Frontier Road repaired three times in the last year. Always gets pot holes after repair."
- "Attempted to fix Frontier Road three times in last year every time after repair it gets potholes again."
- "Empire Street a shocker. Been patched up poorly, very uneven."
- "Repairs in Collins Road redone in less than twelve months. Contractors are not doing a proper job and able to get away with it."
- "Poor foundation of the roads overall in Cambridge. Need to review the base used on the road."
- "Pirongia Road, 2kms out of town not repaired properly. Keep coming back every year to patch it."
- "Shakespeare Street resealed twice and still lifting after resealing."
- "Leamington area patching on roads doesn't last long."
- "Redoing the roads over and over but not doing it properly, eg, Cook Street."
- "Could be better standardisation. Too many different types of surfaces Large chips, small chips, loose chips and rough ones."
- "Frontier Road repaired a number of times and ongoing."
- "Hamilton Road as you enter Cambridge is bumpy and badly repaired."
- "Alexandra Street is a lumpy road. It's been dug up a lot and badly repaired."
- "Thornton Road repaired but rough as guts."
- "Empire Street and Duke Street dug up for infrastructure work. Road not compacted properly."
- "When the Council lift the road to put drains across, be good if they could make it level."
- "Pothole patch up in Mutu Street, Te Awamutu."
- "Foremans Road and Pirongia Road at the 70kmph area frequently being patched up, also the bend before the Shell Station in Rewi Street into Alexandra Street. They're using shoddy workers and or shoddy materials."
- "Potholes develop quickly and they don't fix them soon enough and when they do the holes reappear again."
- "Potholes outside Pak 'n Save need to be done properly."
- "Roads in Te Awamutu that were done last year already have potholes coming through."
- "Frontier Road poor finish, more work required to get smoother surface, patch up job."
- "Frontier Road seal is very patchy."

### Damage by heavy trucks

- "Cattle trucks damage road at roundabouts both end of the street in main road Te Awamutu."
- "Big trucks cause potholes Arapuni Road heading to Kihikihi."
- "Smart Road narrow."
- "High bridge causing havoc. Traffic backed up to Campbell Street. They put 40cm on each side. Too narrow, it's not good enough. They should be looking at traffic flow."

### Too narrow

- "Road needs widening from Thompson Street to Carlyle Street. Cars have to zigzag to pass through narrow section."
- "Bridge repaired Leamington, Cambridge but too narrow."

### Metal roads/need sealing/problems with dust

- "Live 3kms out of town on gravel road. Tried to get our road sealed they said no. Have to ring to get grader out to fix holes and corrugations."
- "Smart Road, metal road. Muddy in Winter and dusty in Summer."
- "Hall Street partly sealed, metal on the sides."
- "Not very satisfied, still have gravel on Maungakawa Road."
- "Hall Street needs tar sealing."
- "The metal roads are shocking."
- "Sealing should be extended to end of Amaru Road, Kakepuku. Dust gets into my water system as I collect water off the roof."
- "Smart Road unsealed, needs sealing."
- "Butler Road not tar sealed. Only one around here not done."
- "Maungakawa Road is gravel."
- "Too many unsealed roads, eg, Maungakawa Road."

### Poor roadside maintenance

- "Limeworks Loop Road, broken fences not repaired."
- "Grass at side of roads needs cutting more often."

### Loose gravel/need sweeping

- "Not good clean up of gravel after road works on Kakepuku Road."
- "Gravel on side of road, Maungakawa Road. I'm a cyclist. Cyclists have to go into middle of road to miss the gravel."

### **Others**

- "The surface lifts after heavy rain and this affects the man holes."
- "Why do they re-gravel roads when no need to. Grey Street in particular. It's a waste of rate payers' money."
- "Risky road crossings for school kids."
- "Roads not designed for cyclists. Need a cycle lane in Te Awamutu area."
- "Speed limit goes from 100kmph to 50 kmph outside our house in Browning Street but everyone goes 70kmph. Need speed camera, should be 70kmph before 50kmph."
- "Bell Road needs a white line in the middle."
- "House shakes and plumbing affected due to passing heavy traffic. Trucks go past 200metres top of Duke Street. No right turn from Hamilton Road to Bryce Street. This would help the problem."
- "Because of bridge being done and also over this side of Cambridge I've seen roads that haven't been done for years. It's just disgusting people have to live like this for years. Think its Hall St."

# Q2 Reasons why they are not very satisfied with – c. "the safety of roads in the District"

### Poor condition/not maintained/unsealed/potholes/poor quality roadworks

- "Heaps of potholes in Pokuru Road. Not good."
- "Brunskill Road surface very bad."
- "Trench in Beechey Street, Pirongia has sunk, makes vehicle very noisy going over it."

### Amount of traffic/very busy

- "Traffic congestion in town, children have to walk through there every day on their own."
- "Big Waits, Victoria Road and Taylor Street."
- "Chaos in Cambridge at 5pm. Bypass will improve things."
- "Brunskill Road traffic heavy."
- "Te Miro road, heavy traffic makes it dangerous."

### Speeding/reduce speed limit/inconsistent speed zones

- "Cars go through Rolleston Road too fast."
- "Speeding drivers in Maungakawa."
- "Te Tomo Street is a speed track and needs speed bumps."
- "In rural areas speeds of 100km is too high, especially in Roto O Rangi Road because the cyclists use it. It's murderous."
- "Reduce speed to 80kmh in country areas. Walks along Bell Road and Paterangi Road and it can be dangerous."
- "100kmh is too fast for metal, rural roads."
- "It would slow the trucks and cars down if there were islands top of Duke Street and no right turn from Hamilton Road to Bryce Street."

### Poor/restricted visibility

- "Trees in Carters Flat block visibility."
- "Need to go on road on mobility scooter to see past the cars diagonally parked. I nearly had a collision near the Countdown Supermarket, Te Awamutu."
- "Put low planting on roundabouts, can't see."

### Narrow roads/need widening

- "In some places they are too narrow."
- "Luck-at-Last Road narrow."
- "Some roads narrow for cyclists in Cambridge."
- "Roto O Rangi Road, narrow road, one way bridge."
- "Owairaka Road very narrow, could be widened."
- "The Victoria Road (High Bridge) could do with widening, not just the footpath."
- "Maungakawa Road and Temiro Road can't be widened apparently but I am concerned about the school kids biking and walking."
- "Brunskill Road one way, very bad."
- "Roads too narrow for traffic, ie, Bruntwood Road, Kihikihi."

### Winding roads/tight corners

- "Tight corners in Maungakawa."
- "Luck at Last Road winding in places."
- "There are some dangerous bends on Norwegian Road."
- "Very windy and steep with blind corners on hill part of Maungakawa Road and Temiro Road. I'm concerned about safety of cycles and school kids on these roads."

### <u>Issues with road markings/signage</u>

- "Some signage inconsistent, eg, where there's a junction, one side is a 'Give Way' the other a 'Stop". They should both be 'Stop'."
- "Big sign at intersection of McClure Street and Baffin Street blocks vision. Told council about it twice but nothing done."
- "Need more warning signs, eg, Pedestrians, Horses, Cyclists, to alert drivers."
- "Some blind corners at the extension of Rewi Street going into Frontier Road before Pirongia could be sign posted."
- "People not obeying signage, ie, Shakespeare Street and Wordsworth Street."
- "Generally need more road markings."
- "By the Te Awamutu College you have to go past the 'Give Way' sign to turn right at the road sign. It's dangerous."
- "In some places they are too narrow. There are no marker pegs and no middle line. Should have signs up and warn to slow down."
- "Lots of changes. Need more signs."
- "Need to go on road on mobility scooter to pass cars parked diagonally. I nearly had a collision near Countdown, Te Awamutu. No sign anywhere and it's a turn off."
- "In Roto O Rangi Road signage is confusing and dangerous with a 'Stop' sign on one side and a 'Give Way' on the other."
- "Replace the 'Stop' sign with 'Give Way' sign at Victoria Street and SH1, should be no right turn."
- "Confusing with "stop" and "Give Way" signs at Victoria Road and Taylor Street."
- "Intersection of Taylor Road and SH1 very confusing signs, one side 'Stop' the other "Give Way'."
- "Needs yellow line between the dam and Arapuni Road."
- "It would help if there was no right turn from Hamilton Road to Bryce Street."
- "Problem when you cross the road near the Club rooms at Victoria Street and Taylor Street, should have stop signs."
- "More signs needed on the bends on Paterangi Road."
- "There are 'Give Ways' at Burns Street and people don't stop, go straight through. More Traffic control required."
- "Some roads have 'Give Way' where they shouldn't be, eg, Burns Street and Byron Street in Cambridge, side streets should give way not main streets."

### Dangerous areas/unsafe intersections/roundabouts

- "Roundabout at the bottom of Shakespeare Street should stay."
- "Intersection at Hogan Road and Fencourt Road needs an Island. Coming from Hamilton, camber of road all wrong and you could get hit."
- "Eastern end of Duke Street in Cambridge where it meets SH1 is a very dangerous junction."
- "T junction at Shakespeare Street and road to Tauranga works well but is being removed. It's good, it should stay."
- "A number of fatal accidents at the crossroads, Hautopu Road and Peake Road."

### <u>Dangerous areas/unsafe intersections/roundabouts (continued)</u>

- "Low level bridge into Leamington was a death trap. The roundabout is outstanding but they're going to remove it. It should definitely stay."
- "Had a few near misses on blind spots on way to Airport at Bird Road and Paterangi Road over to Ohaupo."
- "Big shelter belt Akaterere Road falls on our property and the road. It's not safe. We have to move blockages to let Fonterra trucks and postman through."
- "We have big trees in Roto O Rangi Road that come down in strong winds."
- "It would help if there were islands at the top of Duke Street and from Hamilton Road to Bryce Street."
- "Te Rahu Road and Rogers Place shemozzle, hard to get out."
- "Fencourt Road and Swayne Road dangerous for children to ride bikes."
- "Intersection at Achilles Avenue will become dangerous when temporary roundabout is removed."

### Unsafe for pedestrians/children/more pedestrian crossings needed

- "Bryce Street needs a pedestrian island in the middle to make crossing road easier."
- "No pedestrian crossing on Victoria Street where Primary and middle school is and its dangerous crossing the road."
- "Lots of walkers in Maungakawa."
- "Pedestrian and traffic flow not good at intersection on high level bridge from Pools at Williamson Street and Dominion Avenue."
- "Pedestrian crossing near Church in White Street is dangerous. Bypass will improve things."
- "Need new crossings outside Cambridge School."

### <u>Issues with cyclists</u>

- "Lots of cyclists in Maungakawa."
- "Edges not wide for cycling on most roads around Cambridge."
- "Not good for cyclists, no cycle lanes."
- "Te Miro road lots of cyclists."
- "Cyclist lanes need to be made a little wider and then they will be safer."
- "Need bike cycle lane Kakepuku Road, blind area coming over 'hump' bridge."
- "Need cycle lanes on Fencourt Road and Swan Road, dangerous for children on bikes."

### Issues with drains/flooding

- "Roto O Rangi Road, deep drains full of water."
- "Mowing of roadside needs to be done more often, ie, side roads the growth gets very long. It will then open drains and not be so dangerous."
- "Flooding across road Bryce Street and Queen Street in Cambridge. Work being done, carried out now."

### **Others**

- "It depends on the driver not the road."

# Q2 Reasons why they are not very satisfied with – d. "parking in Cambridge and Te Awamutu"

### Not enough parking/need more

- "Not enough parking in Te Awamutu."
- "In Te Awamutu there's not a lot of parking."
- "Not enough car parks in Cambridge to accommodate the rate of growth in the town."
- "Need to get more parking in Cambridge."
- "Can be hard to find a park in Main Street, Te Awamutu. Need more carparks."
- "Impossible to get a park in the main street in Te Awamutu. Need more car parks."
- "Cambridge diabolical at best of times. Not efficient in town centre."

- "More car parks in Cambridge could be looked into. The population is growing and increasing."
- "Both towns need more car parking."
- "Need more car parking in Te Awamutu."
- "Not a lot of parking in both towns."

- "They did away with angle parking in Te Awamutu now you can't get a park anywhere."
- "They put trees up Main Street of Te Awamutu and stopped the angle parking."
- "In Te Awamutu angle parking would be better. Get more people in to parks and wouldn't stop traffic as people are reversing in."

### The people's fault/don't park well

- "Peoples fault, they park in two parks."
- "Spaces between parallel parking, some drivers need to do better."
- "Some people don't park within the lines, take up two spaces."

### Disabled parking issues/need more disabled parks

- "Should be more disabled parking spaces."
- "Te Awamutu needs more wheelchair parking which has better access rather than on side roads. Need more ramps for wheelchair parking."
- "More disability parks needed in Te Awamutu."
- "I've got a mobility card and sometimes it's hard in town, lots of through traffic."

### Some people park all day/parking taken up by business/workers

- "Shop owners park all day outside their business, fills up street very quickly."
- "In Te Awamutu by Bank Street heading for Teasdale Street next to Anzac Green. Staff park their cars Monday to Friday and no parking available for the public."
- "The shopkeepers and businesses should park around the back out of the way."
- "Workers are using the main street to the detriment of customers."
- "Retailers using car spaces, they should be available for customers."
- "Staff park in car parks, should not be able to hog them all day."
- "Business owners are parking in the main street and outside their businesses, including Council staff."
- "I wonder if it's Council vehicles by the Library."

### Not enough parking in the Post Office area

- "It's hard to get a park in Te Awamutu near the Post Office."
- "Need more parks near the Post Shop in Te Awamutu."
- "Hard to get to the Post Office in Te Awamutu. There's never a park close and I can't walk far."

### Parking difficulties/not enough room

- "Spaces are too small."
- "Ute won't fit."

### <u>Others</u>

- "Cambridge good, Te Awamutu bad."
- "Parking not signed enough."
- "Always pretty packed in both places."
- "Getting worse because of the Avanti Drome."
- "Parking in Cambridge is like winning Lotto."

# Q2 Reasons why they are not very satisfied with – 1. "wastewater services, ie, the sewerage system"

### No sewerage/have to pay to use

- "We just have our own sewerage system and I'd rather have a public one. I live in Pirongia."
- "Having to pay rates for wastewater when we don't get it. Rural area."
- "We are living on a property right next to a subdivision but we are not connected up Swayne Road."

### Needs upgrading/improving/always problems/ blockages

- "By the time they put Kihikihi on, the plant was already at its maximum."
- "Two years ago Council said they have to spend \$26 million on sewerage upgrade and they haven't done it yet. If they don't maintain stuff it will cost more later."

### Bad smells / stench from plant

- "Sometimes you can smell a stink. Not often. Hilliard Place."
- "Smell of sewerage in Hall Street area."
- "We can sometimes smell a sort of sewerage smell in Alpha Street."

### Others

- "Sewerage plant at Cambridge doesn't meet its resource consent."
- "The old houses especially in rural areas don't have an up to date sewerage system. When a house is sold they should have to make its sewerage system compliant in the rural areas."

# Q2 Reasons why they are not very satisfied with – m. "kerbside or roadside recycling service"

### Don't take everything/leave rubbish behind/improve recycling service

- "We have had bottle breakages and it has not been picked up, poor service."
- "Why do they leave broken glass if they drop it when picking up the recycling? They should pick it up just need to carry a brush and pan."
- "Several times they have tipped out half my recycling and left it. They wont take my papers at times. Sometimes they just decide to leave the papers on the ground and they blow away."
- "It's a pigsty. There has never been as much rubbish blowing around town as when they started recycling. Need to improve the service."
- "If they don't take it all its left on the ground."
- "If any rubbish falls out of the containers they don't pick the rubbish up. Improved service required."
- "Some items are not picked up."
- "They will sometimes pick up cardboard sometimes not. Sometimes an issue."
- "The collectors are sometimes overly fussy."
- "There are a lot of papers and stuff blowing around everywhere including plastic containers. You have to clean them up for them."
- "Some bottles not taken. If we have a windy day rubbish flies around. We use a wheelie bin. Waste Management."
- "The recycling cardboard is not collected as much as they say they do even when you fold it small."
- "There are bits lying around. They don't pick up everything."
- "Difference in recyclable and not recyclable by collectors, Golf Road."
- "Often dropped items are left on road."
- "Things not always picked up. Things are dropped. Sometimes don't take plastic and paper Alpha Street."

### Irregular pick up times/late/not collected for days/not always collected

- "Not consistent with time."
- "Recycling collection needs to be improved, some days they don't pick it all up."
- "They are not on time and come at any time."
- "We never know when the damn rubbish man comes."
- "Some weeks fail to turn up."
- "Up to three days late at times. Wind blows things around."
- "Not getting picked up on time. One day late, quite often."
- "Never the same times. Collection of recycling varies from week to week. Sometimes early morning, late afternoon. Need to be consistent."
- "Random pickup. Should be fortnightly but sometimes weekly."
- "It's very random. They change the days too often or say we have to cross the road. I'm dissatisfied immensely."
- "The timing is not consistent. Very difficult to decide when to put rubbish out."
- "A bit slack. Leamington is Thursdays but sometimes they don't turn up for two or three days."
- "Rural collection only every two weeks. A bit hit and miss. Could be better. Sometimes no collection."
- "Wind can be a problem as they pick up late in the afternoon. Plastic bag blows over and rubbish blows everywhere."

### No roadside recycling

- "For my business. They don't collect it in Te Awamutu."
- "We don't have it and we have to pay separately."
- "Don't have a kerbside recycling service because we are rural. Don't get it and have to take to dump. Paying rates for it."
- "We have it but they only come half way up Akatarere Road. I have to take it half way up road."

### No inorganic collection

- "Need for inorganic collection. William Street."
- "I'd like an inorganic one."
- "Need a service where you can put out extras such as broken glass, old TVs, batteries, old tyres."
- "No inorganic waste collection now. No longer available."

### Better communication about service/more information

- "Better knowledge for a resident of what they will take in the recycling bin. Need to provide information to the public on what items can be recycled."
- "Improved notification of when they change times of collection needed, eg, holidays. Need to advise the public of the change to collection days after holidays."
- "Would like notices in paper when recycling service returns after public holidays."
- "People not notified about changes when public holidays. Birds, dogs and wind blow rubbish around."
- "Left sticker on the boxes to tell me what's wrong so not to leave it. Needed one more fold of the box?"
- "Would like to see more on this."

### Need more bins/separate bins

- "We need a large wheelie bin, rather than small bins we have."
- "It would be nice to have two bins."
- "Glass, paper, plastic, not just one bin. Each week should have a separate thing."

### Contractors careless with bins

- "Damaged bins."
- "A few times they just throw it instead of placing it in same place."
- "They've beaten the living daylights out of bin. Rough with my bin."

### <u>Others</u>

- "We have to pay for green bins. They cost \$171.00 a year. If someone pinched our blue bins we have to pay \$20.00. Too expensive."
- "They keep changing the rules. They took my papers for two years and all I did was put them in the Waipa bins. Now I have to tie them up."
- "No roadside refuse collection which is a bit of a pain considering we get recycling pick up."
- "Only fortnightly. Needs to be weekly."
- "Broken bins not replaced often enough."
- "They have reduced the amounts of the plastics they can take. Some of them have to go into the rubbish now."
- "Happy with recycling service. Not happy with rubbish collection. They are in a rural area. Houses at the other end of their road have rubbish picked up by Council. Why don't they go out a little further. They pay rates to Council and have to pay a contractor to pick up their rubbish."

# Q2 Reasons why they are not very satisfied with – n. "the Civil Defence Organisation"

### Never heard about it/don't know about it/lack of promotion/information

- "A lot more could be done by informing the public about it."
- "Needs more info put out."
- "I don't know about it and not given much information."
- "Had no contact whatsoever. We would have expected a lot more. There ought to be something in the local rag, eg, a general article about them and the people to contact. There needs to be more information."
- "Not as much information as there was."
- "I don't know anything. I have not been informed of anything."

### Need more exercises

- "They should have community training on Civil Defence, like open days where they show people what to do in a civil defence situation. Do some Civil Defence courses."
- "I used to be in Civil Defence. It's gone off a bit now."
- "Civil Defence could be more organised than it is."

### Mishandling of Cambridge pool/wasted money/costs too much/other better solutions

- "Too much money spent on consultations, they go round in circles."
- "Spent \$2 million talking about it and nothing done. The pool could have been built for less than that."
- "Spent \$2 million bucks and nothing seems to be happening."
- "I think there was an option to build somewhere else or improve existing pool in Cambridge but money was spent on consultants and nothing was done."
- "Wasted money on consultation and got nothing done."
- "Too much time wasted on decision making."
- "Neglected it for years and now saveable but wasted \$2 million on consultants etc."
- "They need to make a decision and get on with it. We are high users of both pools. I'm sick of it."
- "They shouldn't go over the top financially with a new pool."
- "Too much spending on consultants."
- "Listen to the people in Cambridge. They don't want a new pool."
- "I am opposed to a \$40 million dollar pool."
- "Too much spent on consultation when you could have built a pool for it."
- "I'm absolutely disgusted with the way the Council behaved. They would not listen to the public. It's disgraceful. It was really very poor spending that much money on something the public didn't want. They need to be aware just how incensed people are about this."
- "I don't feel we need flash pool. We don't use pool so why should our rates go up."
- "The amount of money spent on consultation could have built a pool."
- "The issue of the pool badly addressed. Money spent but nothing done on submissions."
- "Need to make a decision one way or the other, wasting money on consultation. "Grow some balls"."
- "Disgraceful that \$2 million was wasted on investigation and no progress."
- "Fundraiser for the pool got a lot of money but nothing done yet."
- "I think St Peters school pool should be used by the public rather than build a new pool."
- "They have the finances now to do the upgrade of a covered roof but haven't started yet."
- "Council spent too much money on feasibility study when they should have spent the money on upgrading the pool."
- "Council spent heaps of money on research for covered pool and still not commenced work on it."
- "Wasted money on consultants that could well have been spent on the pool."
- "They have spent so much money on the decision making and got nowhere."
- "Nothing wrong with Cambridge pool as is. Not happy about Te Awamutu one. It cost ratepayers a lot of money."
- "Spent a lot of money assessing problems which could have been used to upgrade or build a new pool."

### Cambridge needs a heated pool/indoor pool/all year round pool

- "Cambridge pool not open all year round. I would use it if it was open all the time."
- "Would like to see Cambridge pool covered and heated."
- "Needs cover and heating."
- "Need a warm one for winter."
- "Would like a covered pool in Cambridge."
- "Need a cover for the pool. Talking about it for 20 years."
- "Should build a covered one and leave the other one there."
- "Cambridge pool needs heating and covering."
- "They should put a roof over the Cambridge pool."
- "Cambridge not good, needs an indoor pool."
- "Would like a covered pool in Cambridge."
- "Covered pool was going to be built in Cambridge, Begonia house built instead. Not a happy camper."
- "Need the Cambridge pool covered and heated for the elderly to exercise."
- "Need all year round pool facility in Cambridge."
- "Cambridge should have a heated pool."
- "Year round indoor pool needed."
- "Cambridge swimming pool could be improved for the population and be able to be opened in winter."
- "Lots of talking and no action about improvements such as a covered pool."
- "I would like to see Cambridge pool upgraded to year round facility."
- "Cambridge still doesn't have an appropriate facility."
- "No outdoor pool, should have outdoor and indoor."
- "Would like to see the Cambridge pool covered."
- "We have a lovely pool but don't have a winter pool."
- "Should have a closed pool like Hawera and they only have half the population."

### Pool closed too often/restricted access

- "Shut down for cleaning a bit too often as the pools fouled by the public."
- "Regularly shutting down for maintenance, over the holidays too."
- "Te Awamutu pool facilities are often under repair and too often the pools are not accessible due to closing."
- "It was closed during school holidays for two weeks."
- "It's always getting closed."
- "They shut it down during the school holidays, which is crazy."
- "The times are not good. General public excluded at times from the pools, need to review opening hours."
- "Te Awamutu pool closed in the school holidays."
- "Pools closed in school holidays for maintenance."
- "Pool closed a lot. Ratepayers still pay to use it."
- "Pools have been closed at the wrong times, eg, school holidays."
- "Why do they close school holidays for maintenance?"
- "The pool is shut down frequently."
- "Shut all the time."
- "Closed for the school holidays. Not good enough, should be open during the holiday period."
- "Always closed school holidays, not good hours."
- "We have to take our child to Hamilton for swimming lessons. My child has special needs and I'm not allowed a private teacher."

### Pool closed too often/restricted access (continued)

- "Cambridge pool doesn't inform you before you go into the area that they are having classes."
- "A lot of closures and inflexibility, they put swim club in and no room for the public."

- "Cleanliness at Te Awamutu pool should be improved."
- "Below average."
- "Not cleaned as well as it was. The Aquatic Centre has broken tiles on the bottom."
- "Needs more Council staff control and enforcement on babies wearing swim nappies."

- "Staff not looking after Te Awamutu pool to a reasonable standard. We need safe swimming for the children."
- "We use it a lot and often the toilets are unsanitary."

- "The amount of chlorine in the new indoor pool makes you feel sick."
- "Strong smell of chlorine."

### Management/not well run

- "The Te Awamutu pool is not well managed."
- "Te Awamutu pool is very poorly run."
- "Management of Te Awamutu pool isn't good."
- "Change in management. New staff not as friendly, quite militant and they control entry by gates."
- "Change of management meant granddaughter lost her swimming instructor."
- "Better communication to the public required especially when classes are using the pool."
- "At the Te Awamutu pool swimming lessons are difficult to get into. They don't call you back."
- "Management has gone backwards at Te Awamutu pool."
- "Cambridge pool is a good facility but poorly managed."
- "Swimming lessons are hard to get into."

### More money spent on Te Awamutu pool/Cambridge disadvantaged

- "Te Awamutu well catered for but Cambridge is not."
- "Cambridge comes second best to Te Awamutu."
- "More should be spent on Cambridge to keep up with Te Awamutu."
- "Te Awamutu good but not Cambridge."
- "Everyone complains they spend money on Te Awamutu pool but not on Cambridge."
- "We have been waiting for 30 years for a covered pool in Cambridge. Te Awamutu has one and I don't understand why we are so disadvantaged."
- "Cambridge needs a pool complex like Te Awamutu."
- "Want a better pool. Te Awamutu has one, no reason Cambridge couldn't."

### Others

- "As a ratepayer we should be able to use the Events Centre pool facility."
- "Public need to be aware of keeping the pools clean."
- "Built it for the Te Awamutu swim club. Waste of ratepayers' money, they should have fundraised for it themselves."
- "We travel to Te Awamutu with the grandchildren Cambridge is not good."
- "They gave us a Begonia House in Cambridge over 20 years ago but not a winter pool."
- "When the children make a mess in the pool too much water has to be emptied. The pools run into each other instead of being segmented. I think it's the way it's designed."
- "Need to put down rubber mats as dangerous for children."
- "Lifeguards need to be more vigilant at the Te Awamutu pool."

### Poor standard/old/need upgrading/maintenance

- "The one on Walton Street didn't flush."
- "Tiki Domain toilets are sub-standard."
- "Hayley's Lane needs upgrade."
- "Need to be better maintained in towns."
- "The ones in Pirongia need improvement. Too small for traffic out of town."
- "Could do with a revamp, Doors don't lock. Walton Street toilet beside police station."
- "Halley's Lane toilet has really bad taps."
- "Court House one is old."
- "Not maintained enough."
- "The tap on the sink needs replacing or repairing in the public toilet in Cambridge."
- "Nowhere to hang gear in shower at Cambridge loos or to sit to get dressed. Room too dark."
- "Lighting in toilet near the Court House is always out. Others are great."

### Have to pay to use the toilets/should be free

- "Have to pay for the Superloo."
- "Object to paying for using Superloo."
- "You have to pay in Cambridge."

### Difficult to locate/need better signposting

- "More signage needed, Cambridge."
- "I don't know where they are in Te Awamutu."

### Get vandalised

- "The one in George Street is always getting vandalised."
- "They get knocked around in the weekends. Bowls get broken in Te Awamutu."

### No toilet paper, soap, etc/toilet paper rationed

- "Only a tiny box of hand soap, Walton Street."
- "No soap, no facility to dry hands in Ohaupo disabled toilet, toilet paper difficult to get off roll, disabled toilet in Ohaupo."

### Not looked after/could be better/in disrepair

- "General maintenance, lawn needs to be mowed more often."
- "Leaves blow around. Te Awamutu is windy."

- "Not straight forward and simple. Need to improve websites access. I tried to get an ad but couldn't get on to what I wanted."
- "Can be difficult to navigate."
- "I am having trouble navigating in it to find information quickly."
- "Hard to find information on some things. They need a better title heading."
- "Too hard to find information."
- "Not very user friendly. Things are hidden and almost impossible to find, eg, payment options for rate payments."
- "Not user friendly. There needs to be more visuals. You need to able to more directly access what you want."
- "Not very easy to find what you want."

### Missing information

- "They don't seem to advise people of what's happening on their website. Needs to be a page to show what is happening."
- "Cambridge website didn't say transfer station was shut on public holiday but Te Awamutu one does. So we made a wasted trip."
- "Not putting the water quality results up. More information needed on the website."

### Others

- "More lively front page. Direct more at out of town people and trying to attract business. The majority of people accessing website is 95% local people."
- "When I pay my rates online, I can't use Internet Explorer, the most used browser in the world. It's ridiculous that the payment system would be set up by the IT people with a different browser."
- "Needs to be done professionally. It's not aimed at the older generations who are not ofay with websites and it's not efficient."
- "The Council needs to get people there and talk about how they would like to have the website not how the Council think it should be. There shouldn't be such an expectation to use the website as we have an older demographic who may not have access to the web."

- "More buses to Hamilton and Te Awamutu."
- "The businesses just don't want to sell themselves. People go to Hamilton shopping. Instead they should go to Otorohanga and take a leaf out of their book."
- "I think there should be a plan to maintain the character of Cambridge and we should focus on the uniqueness of Cambridge as that is our point of difference."
- "More accommodation needed."
- "No cash point available in Pirongia."
- "Because I'm unemployed. I've been out of work for five months."
