My submission is

I don't think the proposed plan, as it stands, fits with the rural character of the Waipa District. With this in mind, I would like residential buildings to be limited to two stories only, and only two buildings per lot if they were both two-level buildings. I feel that there is still a need for resource consent to ensure that roading traffic is managed well, each unit has adequate sunlight, as well as any neighbouring houses, and each unit has a north-facing outdoor area for healthy living.
